Malone made motion to appoint Chris Price to fill the open council seat. MSB McBurney. None opposed, motion carried. Chris Price was sworn in by Clerk, Lisa Berry.

Les Beck and Luke Maloney were present from the Linn County Assessor's Office to discuss the process of turning over building permit/inspection process to them. The City would need to adopt County codes and enter into a 28E agreement. Once an agreement is reached, residents will contact the Linn County Assessor's office to obtain building permits, answer any building questions, etc.. More information to follow in the coming months.

McBurney made motion to approve D&D Tree Service to remove two dead trees in Rustic Ridge at a cost not to exceed \$2900.00. MSB Hunt. None opposed, motion carried.

There was a vocal rooster causing disturbances in town. The owner of the rooster was notified of the City's Animal Ordinance and the rooster was removed.

The City's AFR was presented to the Council. Clerk identified an issue with the Capital Projects fund related to loan payments and will get more info from other City Clerks or Auditor's Office prior to submission.

Further legal action for nuisance properties has been submitted to the court. Mayor has considered getting a dumpster for citywide cleanup to help with nuisance property clean up issues. Legal action will continue.

City needs to proceed with more information regarding Big Creek Road bridge repairs. Consideration will be given for the necessity of the bridge altogether, since the road doesn't serve a direct purpose to the City. Need to consult with County Engineer about their need for the bridge.

James Drahos is still on the Lower Cedar WMA and they need the City's agreement (clerk to provide). They are also requesting financial support to help raise capital so they can apply for grants. Expected support from a city our size would be \$100-200 per year.

Public Works employees drove the new truck through town with the dump box up to find any clearance issues. Only one issue found at 1243 Bertram St. LED lights have been purchased for the new truck and will be installed within a week.

Multiple buckets of sand have been poured into a sink hole at 1226 2<sup>nd</sup> St but keeps disappearing. This issue will need to be addressed as soon as weather permits.

Tree trimming project for this year will be discussed at the December meeting.

Hunt made motion to adjourn. MSB McBurney. None opposed, meeting adjourned at 8:47 PM.
