Hunt made motion to approve the third reading of ordinance updating water rates to be charged to consumers. MSB Carpenter. Roll call: Price-Aye, Hunt-Aye, McBurney-Aye, Carpenter-Aye, Malone-Aye. Third reading approved, **Ordinance O-2-2019** passed. Water rates shall be furnished at the following monthly rates within the city: \$31.50 minimum billing on first 2,000 gallons of usage, additional \$4.00/gallon on each 1,000 gallons usage above 2,000. A water meter security deposit in the amount of \$25.00 will be included on the consumer's first bill (no change). Rate to take affect December 2019 to be billed to customers in March 2020.

Hunt made motion to approve the Decree by Agreement as entered into with Elda Kay Studt at court hearing on Nov 18, 2019 stipulating final deadline for nuisance remediation will be December 20, 2019, so ECICOG may inspect and make recommendations for improvements. MSB Malone. Roll call: Price-Aye, Hunt-Aye, McBurney-Aye, Carpenter-Aye, Malone-Aye. **Resolution R-6-2019** passed, thereby approving the decree for filing with Linn County District Court.

Carpenter drafted a proclamation to recognize the many years of service to the City provided by Bob Malone, Nancy McBurney, and Bill Mulholland. The City is very thankful to the countless duties performed by these council members to better our community.

Correspondence:

The City wishes to thank Senator Joni Ernst and her staff for following up on our request for assistance regarding FEMA reimbursement for the Ely Street bridge project. Our request was answered, and action taken in an expeditious manner. We've received word that payment should be received within two weeks.

3E Engineering was enlisted to check the generator at the city well (it has not been automatically cycling through weekly test process). Adjustments were made and if they work, no additional repairs will be required. If these adjustments do not work, estimated cost to repair is \$1,151.00.

There appears to be an issue with the well at City Park. Electricity bills have increased dramatically. Breaker has been shut off for the winter; repairs will be addressed in the spring. Consider having Jared Vogeler test this well water periodically.

Brain Engineering submitted documentation for Biderman property changes. Planning & Zoning will meet to review.

Open to the Floor:

State Senator Liz Mathis was in attendance and provided updates from the State Legislature.

Carlyle Bys requested the City consider adding a hidden driveway sign before the corner heading northbound before his driveway on Bertram Street in an effort to slow down traffic around the corner. City to review options.

Iowa Finance Authority is a good resource for storm water financing options.

The January council meeting will be moved from the first Wednesday, which falls on New Years Day, to January 2, 2020 at 7:00PM at City Hall located at 50 Angle Street.

Malone made motion to adjourn. MSB McBurney. None opposed, meeting adjourned at 8:15 PM.
