Price made motion to accept contract with Linn County Sheriff for six hours per week at \$38/hour (up \$1/hour from prior year). MSB Carpenter. Roll call votes: Carpenter-Aye, Wilson-Aye, Mulholland-Aye, Morahan-Aye, Price-Aye. **Resolution R-01-2021** passed.

Motion to accept agreement with ECICOG to pursue land use plan updates not to exceed \$6,116. MSB Wilson. Ayes: Carpenter, Morahan, Mulholland, Price, Wilson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Information has been submitted to ECICOG as well as distribution list to request public input.

Budget workshop planned for Jan 11th at 6pm. Proposed Tax Levy public hearing planned for Feb 3, 2021.

Codification: Section 3 reviewed by Council. Clarification/information requested regarding references to fairgrounds in fireworks ordinance; fire protection; drives & camping in parks; clauses regarding throwing and shooting in city limits.

Aug 10 Derecho Storm Updates:

- FEMA grant process is moving forward. They opened a separate project to report forced labor and equipment charges for cleanup (Category A), and would like to setlle this portion soon.
- More grinding crews are now available under the state contract, so this part of cleanup should begin soon.

- EMC Insurance should be sending their punch list of repairs soon. They would like to settle on trees lost to the derecho now. We estimate 151 trees remain to be cleared or trimmed within 50 feet of insured structures. Wilson made motion to authorize Mayor Hunt to settle with the insurance company on \$1,000/tree, or \$151,000, to clear/trim 151 trees. MSB Mulholland. Ayes: Carpenter, Morahan, Mulholland, Price, Wilson. Nays: None. Motion carried.
- The entire fence surrounding the pump house will need to be removed and replaced.
- Repair status of city park pavilion is yet to be determined.

Correspondence:

- Mayor Hunt: Linn County EMA is considering accepting emergency sirens from Nextera Energy, which may mean responsibility for maintenance would transition to them.
- Carpenter: Lower Cedar WMA is meeting 1/21/2021 to discuss specifics for the exploratory grant.

Open to Floor:

- Questions from residents: Is City considering alternative energy options to cover utilities? Has City considered adding a community garden?
- Public Works department received praise for clearing roadways from the 12/29 storm.

Price made motion to adjourn. MSB Mulholland. Ayes: Carpenter, Morahan, Mulholland, Price, Wilson. Nays: None. Meeting adjourned at 8:07 PM.
